

ALFA SOUTH LOAFERS CUSTOMS AND PROCEDURES

Subsequent to the formation of the South Loafers Chapter in 1976, various customs and procedures have been approved by the Chapter membership. Members not aware of these items have frequently been in violation or have proposed similar rules to the Chapter. To ensure that all members are aware of these items, the following customs and procedures were adopted at the meeting of the Chapter on January 21, 1990.

ISSUANCE OF DOCUMENTS

Each member shall be furnished a copy of (1) By-Laws, (2) Duties of Wagon Master, (3) Roster of Members, and (4) Customs and Procedures.

WAGON MASTER

The wagon master may be issued up to a maximum of \$300.00 to be used as a deposit to secure a campground for campouts. Deposits are to be returned to the treasury before or during said campout.

The wagon master shall be issued \$50.00 from the club treasury to help defray the cost of the campout activities when there are up to 10 rigs in attendance. For each rig over 10, there will be an additional allowance of \$5.00 each from the treasury. There will be an additional allowance of \$10.00 per person fee to be sent in with the registration fees and/or forms. Any surplus of the above funds shall be placed in the Chapter treasury.

SOUTH LOAFER UNIFORM

Chapter uniform shall be white shirt or blouse, black or navy slacks or shorts, and yellow vest or jacket. Members are to wear the uniform at all Rally and Chapter meetings and events designated by the President.

FLAGS

A supply of Chapter flags shall be maintained by the Chapter for sale to members.

BADGES

New members shall purchase a badge by their third attendance at a campout. A fine may be assessed by the Sheriff for failure to wear their badge during campouts and the annual Rally.

C.B. RADIO CHANNEL

Chapter members traveling as a group use channel 12 on their C.B.'s to contact each other.

CAMPOUT NOTICES, PAYMENTS, AND CANCELLATIONS

Notices containing campout information are usually sent out at least 1 month in advance of campout dates.

Payments by members for reservations of campout spaces should be sent to the wagon master unless instructed otherwise. Members cancelling out of campouts after the deadline specified by contract rules of each campout park must pay for their reserved space. The Chapter will not pay from the treasury.

USE OF FUNDS

Fines collected by the Sheriff are to be given to the Sunshine Chairperson to carry on the duties of that office. These funds shall be supplemented as required from the Chapter treasury. Funds collected from special events are to be placed in the Chapter treasury.

HOSTS FOR NEW MEMBERS

The wagon master will act as hosts for new members and see that they have temporary badges. There will be a space on the campout registration form to indicate that they are new members.

50/50 DRAWING

The 50/50 drawing shall be held as designated by the wagon master. One half of the proceeds from ticket sales shall be awarded to the person whose number is drawn, the other half shall be added to the Chapter treasury. The winner must be present to win.

AMENDMENTS

Amendments, additions, and deletions of these Customs and Procedures may be made by a majority vote of members in attendance at any duly called business meeting of the Chapter.
